## Whitehouse Primary School Vision Statement for PE and School Sport 2022-2023

At Whitehouse Primary School, we believe that physical education is an essential part of a child's educational development. We aim to develop a balanced program offering a variety of activities to enhance skills in physical education. Positive participation in physical education will enable children to build self-esteem, teamwork and positive attitudes in P.E.

## We aim to:

- Raise the profile of sports and physical education
- Develop confidence, skills and knowledge
- Be proud of achievements
- Promote fair play and respect
- Educate children to improve health and wellbeing
- Provide quality sporting opportunities for children outside of school curricular time









Our commitment to providing children with high quality competition access and pupils involved in leadership activities was recognised with the School Games National Gold Award after external validation at the end of summer 2018 and again in 2019. The school games award scheme was suspended during the pandemic. The school was recognised by the MK Sports Partnership for its continued to offer to the children through virtual competitions, challenges and activities throughout lockdown, receiving the Virtual School Games mark in 2021. This level of commitment has been sustained by being awarded Gold again in July 2022 and we have achieved the Gold award again this year in 2023.



The school has been recognised for continuing to give children the opportunity to participate in competitive sport, but also for the physical activity, mental and physical wellbeing activities and opportunities we have provided each of the children across the whole of our school. We are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of physical activity and school sport, whether this be running the daily mile, taking part in Funky Fridays, participating in active breaks and lunchtime, competing during sports day and inter house competitions, trying new activities in extracurricular clubs or during a football or netball match.

Sustainability: to build capacity and capability within our school to ensure improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years, we will extend the resources available within PE lessons and the confidence of class teachers and support staff to ensure that learning within PE and games is consistently improving and that the improvements are sustainable.

Our connection with MKSSP will continue to develop teacher understanding of fully inclusive PE lessons and through shared resources this connection is beneficial long term.
